Pottawatomie-Wabaunsee Regional Library

The Pottawatomie-Wabaunsee Regional Library started as an 18 month demonstration project by the State Library of Kansas. The project started in June 1961 and ended on November 6, 1962, with the voters of the two counties approving the establishment of the first two-county regional library in Kansas by a 2 to 1 margin.

The Pottawatomie-Wabaunsee Regional Library is the only two-county public library in Kansas today.

Headquarters for the Regional Library was established at the St. Marys Branch and the Onaga Library became the other Branch library. In 1963 the Alma Branch was added, and the Eskridge Branch was added in 1967.

In 1981, three mini-branches were established. They are located at Harvey-ville, Olsburg, and Westmoreland. In 1996, the fourth mini was opened, located in Alta Vista.

Until 1995, the Library had a bookmobile that stopped at many of the rural communities in the two counties. However, due to the cost of the service and the reduction in the use of the Bookmobile, the Library serves the residents of the two counties from the four branches and four minibranches.

The Pottawatomie-Wabaunsee Regional Library is established under K.S.A. 12-1231 et seq. The Library is supported by a mill levy on the two counties, excluding Wamego and the part of Manhattan in Pottawatomie County. The division of the budget between the two counties is based on population and valuation.

SERVICES AVAILABLE

Books

Both adult and children's books are available at all locations in regular and large print.

Audio Books

Books on cassette—both fiction and non-fiction are available at all locations.

Magazines and Newspapers

Approximately 100 different titles are received.

Videos

The library has a small collection of educational videos that are available for check-out.

Reference.

A qualified staff is ready to assist patrons. If the answer to a reference question is not readily available, the staff will use expert resources to research the answer.

Interlibrary Loan

PWRL has access to library materials from other libraries in Kansas through a statewide borrowing network.

Story Time

Branch Libraries provide a story time for pre-schoolers aged three to five from September through April.

Summer Reading Program

During the summer months, varied programs for younger readers are provided to encourage and sustain lifelong reading habits.

Microfilm Reader Printers / Local History

PWRL owns microfilm copies of all Newspapers printed within the Library's direct service area. Patrons can use microfilm readers to view and print articles at each Branch Library.

Copier & Fax Machine

Each PWRL location has a copier and a fax machine for the public's use.

Public Computers, Internet, & Wireless Access

Each PWRL location has at least one computer with high speed Internet access, software applications, and printing capabilities available for the public's use. Branch locations now offer wireless Internet access during Library business hours.

NCKL - North Central Kansas Library System

PWRL contracts with NCKL to provide better library services to the residents of the two counties. The following are a few of the services PWRL contracts for: Mail-A-Book, Interlibrary Loan, Rotating Books, and Talking Books. In addition any resident of the two counties may apply for a Manhattan Public Library card and receive library service at MPL without additional cost.


